## BUSES AND TROLLEYBUSES

The bus network in Greece is quite extensive. Most buses start running from 5am till midnight. Trolleybuses are similar to buses but instead of petrol, these vehicles operate on electricity - with overhead electric cable, very environmental friendly.



# TRAM

Tram is the most popular public transportation to go to the southern part of Athens and visit the beaches of Greece. Tram also runs on rails like trains but is controlled by an overhead electric system.

## **SUBWAY**

In Greece, Athens is the only city that has subway system. Traveling by Metro is considered the fastest and most convenient way to get around Athens. The subway network is divided into three main lines, connected to bus and elevated train routes.



## ELEVATED TRAINS

Mainly connect the suburbs with the city of Athens and the Athens International Airport. This system is convenient if you want to go to the airport, but the cost of transportation to the airport will be more expensive than traveling within the city.
